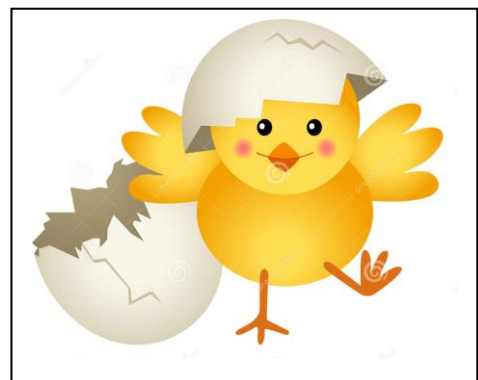
Staffing Updates

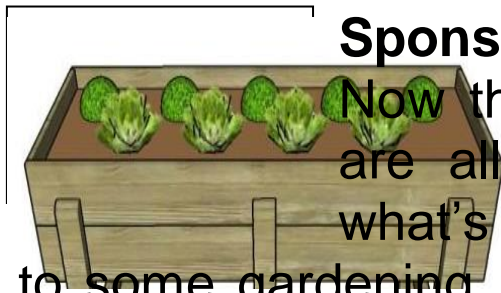
Chicks!

Now the weather is warming up we are all starting to pay attention to what's growing outside and get down to some gardening. If you are keen to do a little gardening with your child, you could sign up to sponsor a planter for a term. We provide a waterbutt, watering cans and some gardening tools, which families can borrow to tend to their planter (an ideal activity for the waiting time before sessions or after Nursery!) 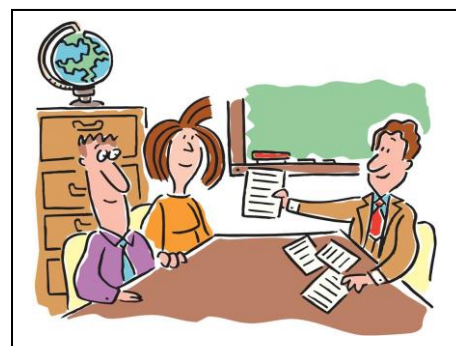


Walk to School

We are making a slight change to our "Walk to School" incentive scheme. Parent Consultations

Parent consultations for Nursery School children will take place during the week beginning Monday 27th March. All Keyworkers will



have evening appointments available on Wednesday 27th March, and some will have other times available during that week as well.

Unfortunately **we are unable to look after any children during the consultations** and it is generally better that children are not present during the meeting with your keyworker, as this can be distracting for parents and carers but also makes it difficult to talk about any more sensitive matters. So we ask that you **please find alternative arrangements for your children during this time.** Thank you.

These will be the last formal consultations of the school year and provide an opportunity to talk through your child's progress and discuss their "next steps".

For those children who are moving on to primary school at the end of the Summer, it will also be an opportunity to start the ball rolling for the smooth transition to their reception class and for parents to discuss any concerns that they might have about this coming change.

Please see your child's keyworker to make an appointment. Consultations for Up to 3s' children will take place during the Summer.



POWs

Talking of your child's progress, we hope you enjoy receiving your child's POW Update each half term, showing pictures of

the things they get up to in Nursery and the progress they are making. We know that we are only part of the picture of your child's development so we would love it if you could send your child's keyworker any pictures of things you get up to at home: perhaps a relative comes to visit, a trip to the farm, cooking or gardening together, or an activity they enjoy doing at home. Just reply to the email that your child's keyworker has sent you containing your child's POW.

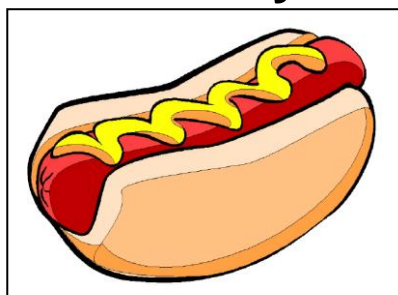
Final INSET Day

children we have with additional needs. However, these strategies are also really useful in recognising the signs of stress that can build in all children and finding ways to keep children calm before the situation escalates (parents and carers, we will happily pass on any top tips we gain!)

Please note that both the Up to 3s' and the Nursery School will be closed to ALL children on this day.

Toy Amnesty

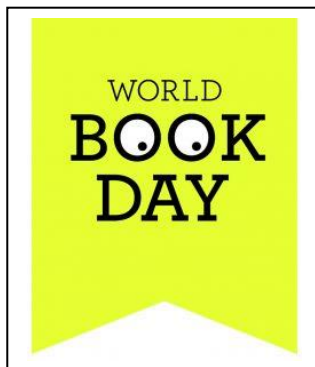
We are finding that many of our smaller toys are going missing (cars, little animals and other small, attractive bits and pieces). We have been made aware by



some parents that their children have “smuggled” these bits out of Nursery in their pockets or their bags (as children do!) You would be helping us enormously if parents and carers could be alert to this and check pockets etc. We are always very grateful if items that have made it home get returned, as it becomes very expensive to keep replenishing items that have gone missing.

To kick-start the process, we will be having a “Toy Amnesty, starting Monday 4th March. We will place a labelled up basket in the foyer outside Nursery and we ask if you could have a hunt around at home for any “bits” that you don't recognise and may have made their way home from Nursery. We will be reinforcing the message

at Nursery in group times. Thanks so much for your help – we hope to see a nice full basket!



World Book Day

The official date for this is Thursday 7th March, but as Wednesday is the day that most of our children come in we will be having our Book Day on Wednesday 6th March. To avoid too much stress with costumes, we are asking all children to come in wearing their pyjamas and bring £1 to donate towards some new books in Nursery. We will have lots of cosy story areas and story props around the Nursery for the children to enjoy and the staff will be acting out a Traditional Tale for all the children at group time, which we hope they will love!

Red Nose Day – Fri 15th March

This is the next date in the term that is a 'dress up and donate' event. Again, we are keeping it simple for you: wear something red and bring a donation for the wonderful work that Comic Relief do.



Early Collection from Nursery

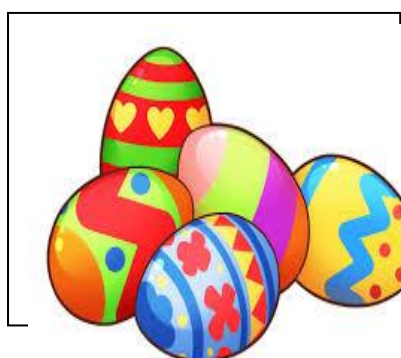
We are noticing a lot of parents and carers are coming in to pick up their children early in the afternoon sessions. We are aware that many of you have children at Portfield School next door, who finish

earlier than us and the wait may feel frustrating. However, it is really disruptive for our children to be collected before the end of the session and they also miss out on Grouptime, which is a hugely important part of the Nursery day. This is a time where children form strong relationships with others in their group and where their Keyworker has planned a session that is tailored to the needs of the group, and is used to support individual children in each group where they may need additional support or extra challenge to ensure they make the best possible progress.

We understand that there are times when there is an urgent appointment or another good reason why you may need to collect your child, but where possible we would ask you to wait until the end of the session (it could be a good time to do the daily reading session with your older child....!)

Parents of Nursery School children who want to book holiday care for the Easter Holidays are reminded that forms need to be in by Wednesday 20th March in order for places to be guaranteed.



Easter Celebrations

As I mentioned at the beginning of the Newsletter, it won't be

long before we are in full “Easter mode”!

Our Nursery School Easter Celebrations will take place on Wednesday 3rd April. Children will parade round the Nursery Garden in their Easter bonnets, roll decorated eggs and then enjoy an Easter egg hunt in the garden.

Children arrive in Nursery at the normal time on this day, to be joined by parents and carers at either 11.00 am for morning and beginning of the week C group parents and carers, or 2.00 pm for afternoon and end of the week D group parents and carers. If your child attends all day every day (our 30 hour children) you can choose to attend either the morning or afternoon parade – just let your child’s keyworker know which you have chosen.

Materials for making Easter hats and bonnets will be available from the Nursery School lobby a couple of weeks beforehand - please take only what you need so there is enough to go round.

So just to recap, children will need to come into Nursery on Wednesday 3rd April with:



An Easter hat or bonnet



A decorated, named, hard-boiled egg for rolling (two if they are staying all day!)

The Up to 3s' Nursery will have their own informal Easter celebrations that week, where they will be rolling eggs and having an Easter Egg hunt, though this will be without parents.

Parents App & Facebook

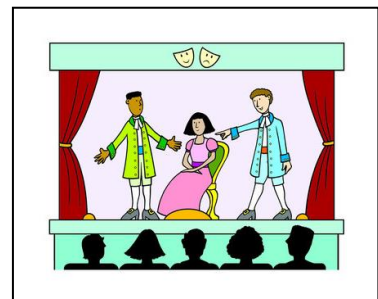
Have you downloaded our “ParentsApp” yet? Do you check and follow our Facebook page?

Rainbow Theatre

We are delighted to announce that we will be having a visit from the Rainbow Theatre again this year. Rainbow Theatre are a



small, travelling theatre company that perform plays in schools and Nurseries and involve children in their performances. We know from last year how much this benefits the children’s language, attention and listening skills, their

understanding of storytelling skills and their self-confidence. This year's visit will be on Wednesday 8th May and they will be performing 4 traditional tales: Little Red Riding Hood, The 3 Billy Goats Gruff, Goldilocks, and the 3 Little Pigs. It will benefit your child hugely if you read and retell these stories with them before the event. We will be doing the same in Nursery.
