Sorry, I'm late. Pick-Ups

We have a request on behalf of our Up to s' staff that parents pick up promptly, particularity at the end of the day and on Wednesdays. The Up to 3s' staff work really long hours and often stay late giving feedback to parents and carers about their children. On a Wednesday, they have a staff meeting that needs to start as soon after 5pm as possible, but they are finding that parents are collecting late, or just on the dot of 5pm and then wanting long feedback sessions. This has meant that the staff cannot start their meeting until quarter or twenty past 5 sometimes, meaning that they have less time for important training and discussions about the children. Please remember that late charges apply for parents who collect late.

Summer is here!!!

The warm weather is here at last and we need to make sure that all our children are safe in the sun. Please make sure your child is well prepared for the sun when you bring them into



Nursery and bear in mind that even cloudy days have the potential to turn into sunny ones.

Sun hats:

We do have some Nursery sun hats but not enough for everyone and in any case children often feel happier wearing their own. If your child is bringing their own hat into Nursery, please do make sure it is clearly named.

Sun cream:

We expect parents of children in Nursery School to apply sun cream at home before bringing them to school in the morning or afternoon. For children who are here all day we strongly advise the use of a brand that lasts all day - there are now quite a few types on the market, available from Boots and other well-known chemists.

For children in our Up to 3s' Nursery, we also expect children arriving in the morning or afternoon to have had high factor sun cream applied at home. If they are staying all day we will re-apply our own Factor 50 sun cream at lunchtime.

🔏 Sandals:

These are lovely for warm weather but unfortunately are not suitable for the rough and tumble of the Nursery Garden, where toes can easily be stubbed or have things dropped on them. We ask all our parents to send their children to Nursery in closed toe shoes - trainers, doodles and crocs are all good options.



I would like to reassure parents that staff are very aware of the need to keep children safe in the sun. They watch carefully for signs that children are getting too hot and send them inside to cool down if necessary. We also make sure that cool water is in plentiful supply, both inside and outside.



Adventurers and Up to 3s' Information Boards

Charlotte has created information for parents and carers of the "Adventurers" (those who attend Breakfast, lunch or tea provision in

Nursery school) and the Up to 3s' parents and carers. She has created a noticeboard at the entrance to the Up to 3s' and one in the Rainbow Room for the Adventurers, which will tell you important information, such as mealtime menus. Staffing and other notices. Do take a look!

although we know it caused some inconvenience for some parents, we deliberately chose this time, as we wanted to test the logistics of parents and carers dropping off and all the problems that could come up at that time of the day. As it happens, it went really smoothly and we thank you all so much for your cooperation. Please could we just ask that, unless you really have to, you don't leave buggies or scooters in the entrance to the building, between the double doors. This is because it makes it very difficult to get to the fire panel, which is the first thing that needs to be checked in a fire. If you have no option but to leave a buggy or scooter there, please ensure that there is a clear path left to the fire panel. Many thanks.

SSC

I am incredibly excited to announce that in September we will be gaining a Special Support Centre as part of our provision. This will be for 8 children in the morning and 8

children in the afternoon who have Speech. Language and Social Communication difficulties. In many ways, this won't bring many changes to what we already do as we already support many children with these difficulties and children who attend this part of our provision will still integrate fully in to the Nursery School. However, the difference is that we will have a Speech and Language Therapist on site for several sessions each week and will support staff to further develop supporting children's in skills Social our Communication skills. Do come and talk to me if you have any questions about this.





Charges for Holidays and Other Absences

There have been one or two parents recently who have been unaware of our policy regarding Nursery fees for breakfasts,

lunches, teas and other sessions which are usually paid for when families go on holiday or whose children do not attend for other reasons, including illness. Please note that we do continue to charge for these sessions, whatever the reason for the absence, as we still have to pay the staff whether or not your child attends. recommend us to friends or colleagues. For parents whose children attend 8-6pm each day, we will discount the cost of a session from your bill. Do spread the word!
