We hope that our new staff settle in quickly and soon feel part of the Chichester Nursery School team!



### Summer is here!!!

When the warm weather finally returns we need to make sure that all our children are safe in the sun. Please make sure your child is well prepared for the

sun when you bring them into Nursery and bear in mind that even cloudy days have the potential to turn into sunny ones.



We do have some Nursery sun hats but not enough for everyone and in any case children often feel happier wearing their own. If your child is bringing their own hat into Nursery, please do make sure it is clearly named.

### Sun cream:

We expect parents of children in Nursery School to apply sun cream at home before bringing them to school in the morning or afternoon. For children who are here all day we ask that you apply before Nursery as usual and bring a bottle to Nursery (not left in your child's bag), with their name on, which we will then reapply after lunch.

For children in our Up to 3s' Nursery, we also expect children arriving in the morning or afternoon to have had high factor sun cream applied at home. If they are staying all day we will re-apply our own Factor 50 sun cream at lunchtime.

### Sandals:

These are lovely for warm weather but unfortunately are not suitable for the rough and tumble of the Nursery Garden, where toes can easily be stubbed or have things dropped on them. We ask all our parents to send their children to Nursery in closed toe shoes – trainers, doodles and crocs are all good options.


I would like to reassure parents that staff are very aware of the need to keep children safe in the sun. They watch carefully for signs that children are getting too hot and send them inside to cool down if necessary. We also make sure that cool water is in plentiful supply, both inside and outside.

### **Wellies**

Although it may be Summer, there is no shortage of water and water play in the garden at this time of year and to avoid soggy shoes we encourage children to put their wellies on if they are exploring



water. However, there are lots of wellies missing so if you have taken your child's wellies home, please return them or bring another pair (named) if they have grown out of them so we can try to look after their shoes.




### **Caterpillars**

In early May we will be having some caterpillars delivered to Nursery (a set for both the Up to 3s' and Nursery School). Over the

days that follow, the children will be able to watch the caterpillars eat and grow, until they form chrysalis', and then...who knows???! I'm sure the children will be excited to tell you about what is happening!

### **Prompt Collection**

It is no secret that the traffic and roadworks in Chichester at the moment are a huge frustration to all drivers. With



this in mind, please ensure you allow enough time

for your journey to enable you to arrive promptly to pick up your child, particularly at the end of the day. If you would like to chat with staff for feedback about your child, please arrive a few minutes before 5pm, as after this time, staff need to tidy up and go home, as their working day does finish at 5pm. If you have been held up for any reason, please call us so that we can reassure your child and make provision for staff to stay with them.

A reminder that any collection after 5pm does incur an automatic £20 charge. For children collected late after other sessions you will be charged the cost of the next session, plus an admin fee of £5.




### **Oving Scarecrow Day**

Don't forget that the Up to 3s' now have a basket for collecting your fruit donations each week. You will see it on the edge of the kitchen worktop in the Up to 3s'.



### Items in Children's Bags

Just a brief reminder please make sure the following items are NOT in your child's bag, as they could be harmful to other children. These

### include:

- Creams or medicines of any description (including suncream)
- Any type of food or drinks (there are many children with allergies in Nursery and what you may consider a safe food could be dangerous to another child)

### **Taking Toys From Nursery**

On the subject of bags, we would be really grateful if you could check your child's pockets/bag on your way out of



Nursery and ensure they haven't decided to 'adopt' any of our toys or resources and bring them home! If you do find these on your way out, or even when you get home, please support your child to bring

them back to us the next day. We know it can be upsetting for your child, as the toy may be something they really want to have, but it is important to reinforce that toys and resources stay at Nursery. As well as teaching your child right from wrong, you will be helping to save us pennies, as when items go missing they have to be replaced. Do ask us for help if you are struggling to have this conversation with your child.



## **Chichester Nursery School Danceathon**

Many of you will know that we are fundraising this year to develop a Sensory Garden for

our children and to help raise money for this on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May we will be dancing non-stop for the whole of a typical Nursery day. This workshop is aimed at addressing some of the common difficulties and questions that parents ask us around parenting: tantrums, bedtimes, picky eating, etc. The workshop will be run by Kathryn and Julie from Nursery School and is open to parents with children of all ages, but is specifically aimed at the 2-5 year old age range.

If you are a parent of Nursery School children and require holiday care for the May/June half term please collect a form from the Nursery foyer and return it to us by **Friday 6**<sup>th</sup> **May.** 



Forms for holiday care over the Summer holidays will be available after half term and will need to be in by **Friday 24th June**.

Please note that holiday care places are limited and will be allocated on a first-come, first served basis.



### Reports

As I mentioned at the beginning of the Newsletter you may soon notice that some Keyworkers will be out of Nursery School more than usual – this is because they

are writing reports for their children that will be leaving to go to school. If your child is leaving us at the end of this term, you will receive their final report from their Keyworker in the first week of July.

Although the writing of so many reports is quite a time consuming task for Keyworkers, it is always such a pleasure to see how much progress children have made during their time with us and we know we only play a small part in these achievements, as it is you, their parents and carers who have the biggest role in their development.

We hope you are pleased with your child's report when you get it. If you have any queries please talk to your child's Keyworker. Up to 3s' children also receive reports, but these are now written just before they move through to Nursery School.



### Parents' Evening

Parent consultations for Nursery School and Up to 3s' children will take place on **Wednesday 30**th **June.** 

(Some Keyworkers may run

an additional session during the Nursery day, due to the number of children in their group.)

This is your opportunity to talk through your child's progress and discuss their 'next steps'.

For those children who are moving on to primary school it will also be an opportunity to discuss your child's school report and any concerns you might have about your child starting school.

Appointments can be made with your child's Keyworker from the middle of June.

Please note: we are unable to look after any children during the consultations and it is better that children are not present during the meeting with your child's Keyworker, as this can be distracting for parents and carers but also makes it difficult to talk about any more sensitive matters. Therefore, please find alternative arrangements for your children during this time or arrange to have your parent's evening appointment over the phone. Thank you.

### Leavers' Celebrations

This is the sad bit - on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> July we will be saying goodbye to those children leaving



to go to Primary Schools in September. We are delighted to be able to invite Parents and carers of leavers to join us for this celebration in the Nursery garden:
