#### **Staffing Updates**


We are sad to have said goodbye to Lillie-Marie. Lillie has got a new role that combines her love of animals and children as an educational farm assistant. We

#### **Nursery Photos**

Each child had their own individual QR code which you should have received by now. This allows parents to view their child's photos and purchase them if they wish.

#### **Parking**

A plea! If you are able to walk to Nursery we would appreciate it.



Our car park, as you will have noticed, gets very busy at the main drop off and pick up times. Parking on the yellow lines, on the roundabout or in front of the green fence/gates is prohibited and when it happens it means that our car park becomes a dangerous place to navigate. We have had several occasions recently where people have been trapped in their parking space because cars have been left parked on the end of a row. This results in there not being enough room for them to be able to swing out of the space. We understand that parents are often in a rush, but the safety of our children and families must come first. If there is not a marked parking space available, please park in one of the roads nearby.



#### Parents' Evening

Parent consultations for Nursery School will take place on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March.

Up to 3s' children will take place as follows:

Loo's Green Group: Weds 8th March

Kirsty's Yellow Group: Weds 15th March

Freya's Red Group: Weds 15<sup>th</sup> March and Weds 22<sup>nd</sup> March

Sarah's Blue Group: Weds 15<sup>th</sup> March and Weds 22<sup>nd</sup> March

This is your opportunity to talk through your child's progress and discuss their 'next steps'.

For those children who are moving on to primary school at the end of the Summer it will also be an opportunity to start the ball rolling for the smooth transition to their reception class and for parents to discuss any concerns that they might have about this coming change.

If you haven't already signed up for an appointment, please ask your child's Keyworker.

Please note: we are unable to look after any children during the consultations and it is better that children are not present during the meeting with your child's Keyworker, as this can be distracting for parents and carers but also makes it difficult to talk about any more sensitive matters. Therefore, please find alternative arrangements for your children during this time or arrange to have your parent's evening appointment over the phone. Thank you.

#### **POWs**

Talking of your child's progress, we hope you enjoy receiving your child's 'POW Update' each half term, showing pictures of the things they get up to in Nursery



and the progress they are making. We know that we are only part of the picture of your child's development so we would love it if you could send your child's Keyworker any pictures of things you get up to at home: perhaps a relative coming to visit, a trip to the farm, cooking or gardening together, or an activity they enjoy doing at home. Just reply to the email that your child's keyworker has sent you containing your child's POW.




#### **Easter Holiday Care Deadline**

#### **Parent Workshops**


Due to popular demand, we will be repeating put Top Tips for an Easier Life Workshop again:



Parents of all-day children are welcome to attend the afternoon session if it is easier for them.

The **Up to 3s' Nursery** will have their own informal Easter/Spring celebrations that week, though this will be without parents.



Holidays During Nursery Time We have had notification of several families who are going away on holiday during Nursery time. We understand that whist children are not of statutory school age it is popular to take a holiday in term time. However, because we employ consistent daily staffing, rather than ad-hoc 'shifts' we are unable to offer refunds for any absence. This is set out in both our 'Attendance' and 'Non-Payment of Fees' policies which are available to view on our website or parents can request a paper copy of these from the Nursery office.
