his guitar along to our singalongs.



Nursery Clothing

Bad Weather Announcements


Although it is quite mild again at the moment, just in case we have any snowy weather, please be aware that in the event of

Children's belongings

Please can we ask that you are mindful about what is in the bag that your child brings to Nursery each day. As we encourage the children to be independent where



possible, their bags are stored within their reach, so it is very important that food or medications are not kept in them. A snack that has been popped in for the walk home may be a favourite for your child but might cause a dangerous allergic reaction for someone else's.

It would also be a very big help to us if you could keep home toys at home. While we understand that the children like to have familiar things with them and to show them to their friends, but we get very sad children when their favourite toy gets lost amongst all of our toys or when other children want to play with them too.

Core Books



Each month in Nursery School, we choose a classic children's story and revisit it lots of times throughout the month so that the children can get to know it really well. As you may have seen from the display in the foyer, this month's story is 'Walking in the Jungle' by Julie Lacome. At home, your child might like to collect up their jungle animal toys and use them to tell you the story. Get ready for lots of animal noises!

February's core book will be 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt!' by Michael Rosen and in March we will be reading Farmer Duck by Martin Waddell.
